Raul Yzaguirre

Raul Yzaguirre was born and raised in the Rio Grande Valley of South Texas. His life of service and leadership started as soon as he was old enough to understand the profound discrimination experienced by his fellow Mexican Americans. His own grandfather was nearly lynched coming home from work after a curfew imposed only on Mexican Americans in south Texas. For three decades Professor Yzaguirre was

President and CEO for the Washington DC think tank, *LaRaza*.

Today, continuing his lifelong mission to improve opportunities for Hispanic Americans, Mr. Yzaguirre is Presidential Professor of Practice at ASU and has established the Center for Community Development and Civil Rights which focuses on community development, education for practitioners, program-based solutions, and academic scholarship. Additionally, Mr Yzaguirre is a frequent commentator and has appeared on *NBC Nightly News*, *ABC World News Tonight*, *CBS Evening News*, and *The Today Show*.
